
Our journey began with a phone call from the Doctor stating that Betty has pancreatic cancer.

God of the Mountain: The family of God stepped up resulting in our connection with the President and CEO of Pancreatic Cancer North America (who has kept her promise to walk with us throughout

this journey), the Chief of Radiologist at a Toronto hospital for an MRI, and the top pancreatic surgeon, all resulting in an operation within 5 weeks.

God of the Valley: the wheels fell off as 3 days after the operation, Betty was rushed in for an emergency operation due to a misfunctioning staple resulting in her being septic and nearly losing her life. Recovery had many setbacks. In November, we had an early Christmas with the whole family and what we thought would be the last time for grandchildren and great grand children to see grandma. Mid December there was an amazing turn around and today she is nearly 100% back with us. All those walking with us through this valley along with medical people are amazed at this recovery.





Yes, we are grateful for over 50 years of serving together and we have both entered our 80th year when we are promised "3 score and 10 years". Paul said: "For me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. But if I go on living in the body, this will mean fruitful labor for me I desire to depart and be with Christ which is far better. But it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body." Phil 1:21-24

Ever since his days in Regina, he always attended or showed up at General Assemblies to teach a seminar or just connect with many whom he was mentoring.

We were also blessed to pastor the family and see Martin and Diannah's children develop and eventually have significant ministries for the Kingdom. Son Bo, is a pastor today in Oregon and




wrote: "We lost our dad this weekend. I am reduced to rubble. He was my hero and mentor and deepest friend. Most of who I am either comes from him or is directly related to him. A huge part of my heart is vacant now. This picture is from a doctoral class that I had the honor of teaching with him six times at Alliance Theological Seminary. Undoubtedly one of the highlights of my entire life."

After leaving Regina, Martin was the Founder & President, Global Leadership Ministry at Alliance Theological Seminary. He also directed the Doctoral program there.

Martin died following a brief illness. February 23, at 2 p.m. at Long Hill Chapel in Chatham, NJ "A Life Worth Celebrating".

Global Leadership sent out a notice and said "Martin is a man worthy of honor. He lived a Godly life marked by God's presence and he impacted countless numbers of people. 
Ted's wif Heather, shared many wonderful years with him, working faithfully by his side, spurring him on to hope as he battled cancer.

John "Don" Scott -September 15, 1938-January 15, 2024

On January 15th, 2024, John Donald Scott—Don—completed his final lap of a marathon battle with

leukemia. True to his nature, all day Don was fielding phone calls, encouraging people, thanking everyone who helped him, giving glory to God, reminiscing with his precious Doris, blessing his kids and grandkids. As his family, we will miss him deeply, but we take great comfort in the fact that Don, though he is gone, is now fully healed and alive with Christ as promised in John 11:25.

Don was born in Edmonton. He and his siblings were in foster homes, lacking stability until God intervened and provided a loving family for Don when he was 16. At that time, Rev. Emil Axene and his wife took Don and his brothers into their small home after their mother had succumbed to leukemia. It was under the loving, godly guidance of this pastor that Don gave his heart to the Lord.



Don served in the Canadian Navy for three years, then went on to graduate from Canadian Bible College in Regina, Saskatchewan. He was ordained by the Christian & Missionary Alliance in 1964 and served three years as a pastor in Saskatchewan before he and his first wife, Nola, went to Laos as C&MA missionaries in 1964. In 1971, he joined World Vision where he helped to expand World Vision's work in Asia and Latin America until he and his family returned to Canada in 1983 where Don continued to work for World Vision Canada. Don was president of World Vision Canada from 1987 until 1995 and then worked closely with World Vision International leadership until he retired in 2003.

Don was married to Nola for 56 years. Together they served the Lord around the world and raised their kids with humour, grace, and deep love. It is because of our parents' examples and witness that each of us loves Jesus. Don always said that it was because of Nola that he became the man God intended him to be. Nola suffered with dementia for ten years, and Don faithfully cared for her throughout that difficult journey until she passed away in August 2014. Dad was our role model as we cared for him these past three years.



Don was a great storyteller. He loved to share about the impact the years of walking the mountains of Laos had on his life. He would tell of the miraculous events that transpired in the last days before the fall of Saigon. Every story demonstrated his love for God and for people as well as his evangelist's heart. We saw this same commitment to love God and people and share Jesus as he walked hospital halls in Edmonton and Wetaskiwin over these past three years.

Don leaves behind his precious wife, Doris Pearson Scott; his grown children he loved very much,

As a family, we give glory to God. Don—Dad—finished his race well, by the grace of God. He always said that he never feared death because of his faith in Christ. He was believable, and we will miss him so much. A service of gratitude to God in memory of Don was held on Friday, January 26th at 1:30 pm at New Sweden Mission Church in Wetaskiwin. 

He began his ministry as an itinerant evangelist in 1974 before he was appointed as the Professor of Evangelism for the Murray W. Downey Chair of Evangelism at Canadian Bible College and Canadian Theological Seminary from 1984-1994. Currently, TV serves as the

Director for the Centre of

Evangelism & World Mission. He serves on numerous national and international boards. He is the Chair of the North American Council for South Asian Christians (NACSAC) and President of the Fellowship of Canadian Evangelists (FOCE).

The flowers you gave me symbolizes "crowns" that I will put at the feet of Jesus during the "Reward Day" in heaven.


Please pray that we will finish well, that in spite of our limitations we will continue loving and serving God.




